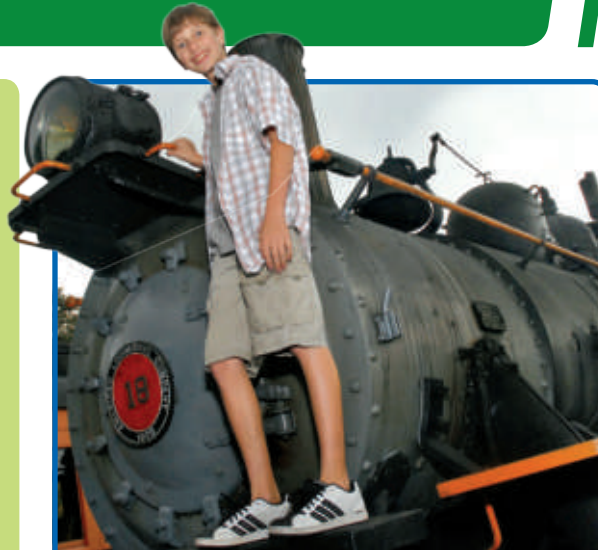


Books For All

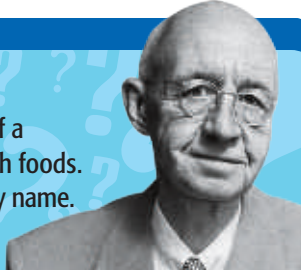
